Thank you for your interest in volunteering with North Wales Wildlife Trust. With 35 nature reserves to manage throughout North Wales, there is always lots of work to be done and we would love you to come along and join us. It's a great time of year to discover the plants & animals that make our nature reserves such special places.

This programme lists the volunteering opportunities that are available throughout **July 2021** on our nature reserves in Denbighshire, Flintshire & Wrexham and as part of our 'Woodlands for Water' project. Our 'Woodlands for Water' project aims to create, connect and enhance habitats within the catchments of the Afon Alun and Afon Chwiler, with a particular focus on woodlands and improving water resource management within the two catchments. The project involves many partner organisations including the Welsh Dee Trust, Tree Shepherds, the Clwydian Range and Dee Valley Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, as well as Flintshire and Denbighshire County Councils. Every Wednesday, Thursday & Friday there are opportunities for you to volunteer with our Woodlands for Water project. If you wish to attend any of the work days, you <u>must</u> book ahead directly with the task organiser (their contact details are listed below). Please <u>do not</u> travel to attend a work day without the task organiser having expressly acknowledged that it is OK for you to attend.

Meet at the office car park. 10 a.m. until 3.30 p.m. Aberduna is a striking 20-hectare reserve offering stunning views across the Alyn Valley to Moel Famau & the Clwydian Range. The entire site is underlain by limestone which influences the habitats found on the nature reserve. Today we will be scything bracken in the terraces; pulling thistles and, weather permitting, recording butterflies along our butterfly transect. It sits within an agricultural landscape and is linked to other scattered woodlands by ancient hedgerows and tracks that are the last refuge for many native plants and animals. The woodland has a long post-industrial heritage and its timber has been used to support the local mining village for centuries. Today this peaceful woodland & sunny grassland are filled with colour & life, including the nationally rare Deptford pink and dozens of other wildflowers.
