

North Wales Wildlife Trust Nature Reserve Work Parties in NW Wales - Anglesey, Conwy & Gwynedd July 2021

Thank you for your interest in volunteering with North Wales Wildlife Trust. With 35 nature reserves to manage throughout North Wales, there is always lots of work to be done and we would love you to come along and join us. It's a great time of year to discover the plants & animals that make our nature reserves such special places.

This programme lists the volunteering opportunities that are available throughout July 2021 on our nature reserves in Anglesey, Conwy & Gwynedd. If you wish to attend any of the work days, you <u>must</u> book ahead directly with the task organiser (their contact details are listed below). Please do <u>not</u> travel to attend a work day without the task organiser having expressly acknowledged that it is OK for you to attend. Thank you.

Our work parties provide an interesting and lively mix of practical work and informal training. Each work day will consist of a brief introduction to the nature reserve and its management. We will supply work gloves, tools and hand washing facilities.

Wednesday 30th June

Gwaith Powdwr, near Penrhyndeudraeth, Gwynedd.

From 1865 until 1995 this site was home to a world-renowned explosives factory. The North Wales Wildlife Trust took over the site when it was decommissioned in 1998 & since then nature has flourished. Our work will be a mixture of enhancing buildings for wildlife and people; path maintenance; species surveys and habitat management – anything from painting a giant ballistic pendulum to surveying for slow worms! Wednesday 30th June

Mariandyrys, near Llangoed, Anglesey.

Enjoy extensive views of the mountains and coast as we carry out heathland management work. There will also be an opportunity to take part in plant & reptile surveys. Please contact Matt Cole if you would like to attend.

Thursday 1st July

Rhiwledyn, Llandudno.

Rhiwledyn, also known as the Little Orme, has stunning sea views and wonderful limestone grassland. We will be carrying out a survey of the rare Spiked speedwell as well as clearing some of the paths to improve accessibility for our visitors. Please contact Rob Booth if you would like to attend.

Friday 2nd July

Spinnies, Aberogwen, near Bangor, Gwynedd, **morning only 10 a.m. until 1 p.m.** A variety of tasks around the reserve with an opportunity to do some bird watching! Meet at the nature reserve at 10 a.m. Contact Matt Cole for more information.

Wednesday 7th July

Gwaith Powdwr, near Penrhyndeudraeth, Gwynedd.

Today we will be carrying out a variety of different jobs which will benefit the wildlife which lives on the nature reserve and the people who visit. Please contact Rob Booth if you would like to attend.

Wednesday 7th July

Caeau Tan-y-bwlch, near Clynnog Fawr.

Swathed in wild flowers in spring & summer and offering lovely views of the coast, these traditional hay meadows offer a glimpse of our countryside's past. An opportunity to see the flower-rich hay meadows at their best as we undertake some bracken control – a good opportunity to try your hand at scything. Thursday 8th July

Gogarth, Great Orme, Llandudno.

This nature reserve is a slice of limestone grassland and maritime heath on the western slopes of the Great Orme, teeming with butterflies and wildflowers in the summer. Today we will be clearing bracken & non-native cotoneaster to protect this valuable habitat. Please contact Rob Booth if you would like to attend.

Wednesday 14th July

Gwaith Powdwr, near Penrhyndeudraeth.

Our work focusses on maintaining the variety of habitats whilst protecting the history of the site. Today we will be carrying out a variety of different jobs around the reserve including scything bracken; clearing rhododendron; reptile surveys and path clearance. Wednesday 14th July

Cors Goch, near Llanbedrgoch, Anglesey.

The complex geology and wealth of different habitats make Cors Goch one of Wales's most diverse, colourful nature reserves & part of an internationally significant network of fens in Anglesey. Today we will be carrying out a variety of different work around the nature reserve which will benefit wildlife & people. Don't forget your wellies! Please contact Matt Cole if you would like to attend.

Thursday 15th July

Cors Bodgynydd, near Betws-y-Coed.

The wide variety of wetland habitats at this remote, upland nature reserve in the Gwydir Forest were created when water levels were raised artificially in the 19th century to supply water for the mining industry. Today we will be carrying out fencing repairs to ensure that the site is stock-proof. Wellies essential! Please contact Rob Booth for more information.

Wednesday 21st July

Gwaith Powdwr, near Penrhyndeudraeth.

This nature reserve is an important site for reptiles including Grass snakes & Slow worms. If the weather conditions are favourable, you will have the opportunity to take part in a reptile survey as well as helping to enhance buildings for wildlife and people; path maintenance and habitat management. Wednesday 21st July

Cors Goch, near Llanbedrgoch, Anglesey.

Discover the spectacular patchwork of habitats, each with its own unique character and array of wildlife. Today provides an opportunity to master the art of scything using an Austrian scythe. It's very relaxing and much quieter than using a brushcutter! Please contact Matt Cole if you would like to attend.

Thursday 22nd July

Bryn Pydew, Glanwydden, near Llandudno.

The limestone pavements, flower-rich grasslands & ash & yew woodlands found on this nature reserve support a wealth of plant & animal life. Today we will be working in the limestone pavement areas as well as controlling non-native cotoneaster to prevent it overtaking the precious areas of limestone pavement & grassland. We will also be clearing paths to improve access for our visitors. Please contact Rob Booth if you would like to attend.

Friday 23rd July

Eithinog, Bangor, Gwynedd.

Overlooking the Menai Strait on one side and with views of Snowdonia on the other, this is a much-loved wild oasis in the heart of Bangor. This is one of our monthly tasks to help us keep on top of site management. Today we will be building another section of boardwalk to improve access through one of the wetter areas of the nature reserve. Please contact Matt Cole if you would like to attend.

Gwaith Powdwr, near Penrhyndeudraeth.
