It keeps its chunky domed form when washed ashore. The thick, pinkish tentacles are often still attached to the bell. They can be seen in Winter.	Colour ranges from bright red to dirty brown depending on how long the jellyfish has been on the shore. It's tentacles can trail a long way away from the bell.	The striking radiating lines make this jellyfish easy to identify even on the beach. The frilly arms can sometimes be seen trailing away from the bell.	This jellyfish is translucent so can blend in with the sand when it is washed ashore. The purple/pink crescent shape rings will stand out from the background.	They are delicate when washed ashore and loose tentacles can be found. Not always blue, so can easily be confused with a Lion's Mane Jellyfish.
