

North Wales Wildlife Trust Nature Reserve Work Parties in NE Wales (Denbighshire, Flintshire & Wrexham) December 2021

Thank you for your interest in volunteering with North Wales Wildlife Trust. With 35 nature reserves to manage across North Wales, there is always lots of work to be done and we would love you to come along and join us. Winter is a great time of year to volunteer and discover why our nature reserves are such special places.

This programme lists the volunteering opportunities that are available throughout **December 2021** on our nature reserves in Denbighshire, Flintshire & Wrexham. You can also volunteer with our Woodlands for Water & Our River Wellbeing projects. Our work parties provide an interesting and lively mix of practical work and informal training. **Details of the locations of our nature reserves can be found on our website** www.northwaleswildlifetrust.org.uk Please wear work clothes and stout boots/wellies and bring waterproofs and a packed lunch. We will supply work gloves, tools and hand washing facilities.

Friday 3rd December

Aberduna, Maeshafn, near Mold. Meet at the office car park. 10 a.m. until 3.30 p.m. Aberduna is a striking 20-hectare reserve offering stunning views across the Alyn Valley to Moel Famau & the Clwydian Range. The entire site is underlain by limestone which influences the habitats found on the nature reserve. Today we will be managing bramble growing in recently coppiced areas of the woodland and continuing the rotational coppice management in the woodland. Tuesday 7th December

Coed Cilygroeslwyd, Pwll-glas, near Ruthin. Meet in the Siop Pwllglas car park. 10 a.m. until 3.30 p.m.

Another opportunity to imitate wild boar as we disturb the ground with mattocks to stimulate the germination of dormant seeds of *Stachys alpina* (Limestone woundwort). This is Denbighshire's county flower and was once much more abundant within this woodland. We'll also be clearing brambles which are encroaching on to wild daffodil habitat. Wednesday 8th December

Minera Quarry, Coedpoeth, near Wrexham. 10 a.m. until 3.30p.m. Why not become a Minera Quarry Volunteer and witness the incredible power of nature as it slowly reclaims this former lead and limestone quarry into a wildlife haven? In the long term, we aim to create a mosaic of habitats showing the full successional story from bare rock to established woodland, as well as protecting important populations of protected species, such as bats. Our volunteers get involved with a variety of tasks to cater for all abilities including improving access, signage, scrub clearance, grass cutting, fencing and wildlife surveys. Friday 10th December

Big Pool Wood, Gronant. Parking off the road, close to the reserve entrance. 10 a.m. until 3.30 p.m. Meet at the entrance to the reserve.

A wonderful reed bed and woodland site filled with wildflowers and birdsong and facilities that allow you to get closer to wildlife. Continuing on from last month's work, we will be managing reeds in the pool to maintain open water for overwintering waterfowl. We will also be removing a fallen tree from the pool near Gill's Hide. Tuesday 14th December

Aberduna, Maeshafn, near Mold. Meet at the office car park. 10 a.m. until 3.30 p.m. The last Aberduna task of the year! We will be burning brash from last month's hedging work, followed by a gathering around the fire. Enjoy some mulled apple juice, mince pies and other festive treats! Friday 17th December

Gors Maen Llwyd, 7 miles south-west of Denbigh. Meet in the main car park at Gors Maen Llwyd at 10 a.m. (Grid Reference: SH97068 58064).

Spend the last volunteer day of 2021 enjoying one of our largest nature reserves. It's also a final opportunity to cut a Christmas tree for conservation! We will be removing invasive Sitka spruce saplings from the rare heathland habitat. Wind/waterproof clothing and all-terrain footwear required. Wrap up well!
