



How to run your own shark eggcase hunt!

What you will need:

Bucket or bag, wellies or walking boots, ID guide, mobile phone for pictures!

Step 1: Choose your beach.

Take your buckets or bags and head to the shore!

Make sure that you are careful whilst looking through the strandline and in amongst the vegetation and keep your eye on the tide. You don't want to get caught out!

Step 2: Get hunting!

Have a good look along as much of the beach as you want! Let's try to fill your buckets and bags with eggcases!

Step 3: Time to ID.

Once you've found as many eggcases as you can, it's time to find out which species they belong to. Use the ID guide in the pack that you were given on the 'Great Shark Eggcase Hunt' event and compare the different sizes, shapes and features of all of the eggcases.

Step 4: Don't forget to record your findings!

This is really important and it helps us understand which species we have around Wales and where they are found.

Search for the 'Shark Trust - Great Eggcase Hunt' online and click on the 'Record your eggcases now' tab. Here, you'll be able to record how many of each species you found.

Don't forget to add Project Siarc in the organisation tab at the start!
