We're a small charity with big ideas! We believe that everyone has a part to play in nature's recovery. We are the only organisation in North Wales working to protect and enhance wildlife and wild places throughout the region. Through our work with businesses, organisations and the public we are mobilising others across the region and the rest of the UK to act for wildlife. As a registered charity, we are supported by over 9,500 members, and are part of a movement of 46 Wildlife Trusts with a collective membership of over 800,000.

Our purpose is to bring wildlife back, to empower people to take action for nature, and to create a society where nature matters. With the invaluable support of volunteers and members we manage 35 nature reserves in North Wales, and have an ambition to reverse the declines in nature. We work with landowners to protect and connect wildlife sites across the 6 counties of North Wales and inspire local communities and young people to care for wildlife where they live.

All our work is underpinned by our values. We have a love for the intrinsic value of nature, we work with enthusiasm and purpose, our innovation is evidence-based, and we act with respect and integrity.
