Be Aware!

When on the lookout for beavers, please be mindful of the following advice:

- Wear warm clothes and sensible closed shoes. Carry waterproof clothing (and extra clothing) as conditions can change rapidly even in the warmer, drier months.
- Do not approach the beavers and be sure to observe them from a safe distance to avoid disturbing them or other wildlife.
- Keep quiet and avoid sudden movements.
- Dogs will make it trickier to spot a beaver. If your dogs are joining you, please be sure to keep them on a lead at all times.
- Take a phone, binoculars and a camera so that you can take photographs and report beaver sightings.
- Beavers are especially active at sunrise and sunset so aim to be out early or late.
- Late spring and summer are ideal periods to spot a beaver because of the longer periods of daylight.





How to Report a Sighting

When looking for beavers, please bear in mind the information shared in our guide called Spot A Beaver!

Recording your sighting is simple. Just visit this web address from any internet-connected device:





Step 1: Choose your Language

On first visiting the site, you will see this screen. Select your preferred language (Cymraeg or English).









Step 2: Login to your ORS Account

You will need a Cofnod Online Recording System (ORS) account to submit your sightings. Login if you already have an account. Otherwise, click on "Sign Up".



Click here to register. The system will confirm your email address so check your spam folder if necessary.




Step 3: Enter Records

Once you have logged in, click on "Enter Records" to provide details of your beaver sighting/field signs.

Step 4: Select Welsh Beaver Project

Click on "Welsh Beaver Project".




Step 5: Complete and Submit the Form

Fill out as many fields as possible.

Remember that fields masked with an asterisk (*) must be completed.

or tablet. If necessary, please
also ensure that you adjust the

to your photos. (This is the
default setting on most
devices.)




Viewing and Amending your Sightings


