With 35 nature reserves to manage across North Wales, there is always lots of work to be done and we would love you to come along and join us. It's a wonderful time of year to visit our nature reserves and discover why they are such special places.

Join us to remove dead invasive cotoneaster from this lovely limestone grassland and help offer native wildflowers and grasses the space they need to grow. # Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> October

Aberduna, Maeshafn, near Mold. 10 a.m. until 3.30 p.m. Meet in the office car park. Aberduna is a striking 20-hectare reserve offering stunning views across the Alyn Valley to Moel Famau & the Clwydian Range. Today we have lots of jobs to do including woodland management, installing new interpretation signs and removing scrub from the limestone grassland. Please contact Jordan Vigus-Hurst if you would like to attend.

# Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> October

Coed y Felin, Hendre, near Mold. 10 a.m. until 3.30 p.m. Please check with Carl which car park to meet in.

Coed y Felin is an ancient oak/ash woodland planted with sycamore, beech and sweet chestnut. The woodland has a long post-industrial heritage, and its timber has been used to support the local mining village for centuries. This peaceful woodland & sunny grassland are filled with colour & life, including the nationally rare Deptford pink and dozens of other wildflowers.

Today we will finish scything the top meadow and clearing arisings. Any pathways which are low on stone, will be topped up. We'll also begin to remove scrub on the slope – digging out or cutting and treating if the weather permits. Please contact Carl Williams if you would like to attend.

#### Wednesday 8th October

Minera Quarry, Coedpoeth, near Wrexham. 10 a.m. until 3.30 p.m. Meet in the nature reserve car park.

Join us as we work to halt successional processes to maintain a mosaic of habitats at this former limestone quarry. Please contact Jordan Vigus-Hurst if you would like to attend.

# Friday 10<sup>th</sup> October

Graig Wyllt, 3 miles SE of Ruthin on the B5429. 10 a.m. until 3.30 p.m. Meet at the Three Pigeons Inn at Graigfechan at 10 a.m., or if you are familiar with the reserve, feel free to head straight to the reserve entrance (What3Words:

escorting.increment.sits) and we will meet you there at 10.15 a.m.

Today we have a variety of jobs to do in this wonderfully secluded woodland reserve including installing new interpretation signs, installing bird and bat boxes, planting trees to replace any which failed last season, and other habitat management work. ### Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> October

Cors y Sarnau, Sarnau, near Bala. 10 a.m. until 3.30 p.m. Meet in Sarnau village. Our regular monthly visit to this reserve. Don't we all scrub up well! Today we will be clearing scrub from the peatland restoration area to promote the growth of wetland plant communities. Please contact Jordan Vigus-Hurst if you would like to attend.

#### Friday 17<sup>th</sup> October

Coed y Felin, Hendre, near Mold. 10 a.m. until 3.30 p.m. Please check with Carl which car park to meet in.

Today we will be cutting up logs and clearing paths throughout this lovely woodland. We'll also continue to dig out or cut and treat the scrub encroachment on the Deptford pink slope, hoping to give our seedlings the best chance of success. Any sapling dug out will be transplanted in our other nature reserves. Please contact Carl Williams if you would like to attend.

# Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> October

Marford Quarry, near Wrexham. Meet in the accessible car parking area off Springfield Lane (What3Words: creatures.galloping.spooked). 10 a.m. until 3.30p.m. Our Minera Quarry & Marford Quarry volunteers meet on the 2nd & 4th Wednesday of every month. Why not join them and witness the incredible power of nature as it slowly reclaims these former quarries into wildlife havens?

Pop goes the birch tree! Today we will be focussing on opening up areas of this former sand and gravel quarry by removing regenerating tree saplings, benefitting the sand-loving invertebrates here. Please contact Jordan Vigus-Hurst if you would like to attend.

#### Please note – Thursday not the usual Tuesday!

Big Pool Wood, 2.5 miles east of Prestatyn. 10 a.m. until 3.30 p.m. Parking off the road, close to the reserve entrance. Meet at the entrance to the nature reserve. A wonderful reed bed and woodland site filled with wildflowers, birdsong and facilities that allow you to get closer to wildlife.
