Potential impacts:

Heart-leaved houttuynia forms dense mats that can exclude other plants.

Habitat:


Prefers damp conditions such as pond edges, ditches, marshland or woodland.

A herbaceous perennial and vigorously spreading ground cover. Leaves have a pungent smell when rubbed.

It was introduced to Britain in 1826 and was first reported in the wild in 1992.

How it spreads:

Spreads by rhizomes and can regrow from the smallest of fragments.
