

North Wales Wildlife Trust Nature Reserve Work Parties in NW Wales - Anglesey, Conwy & Gwynedd January 2026

With 35 nature reserves to manage throughout North Wales, there is always lots of work to be done and we would love you to come along and join us. Winter is a great time of year to volunteer on our nature reserves and discover why they are such special places.

This programme lists the volunteering opportunities that are available throughout January 2026 on our nature reserves in Anglesey, Conwy & Gwynedd. If you wish to attend any of the work days, you <u>must</u> book ahead directly with the task organiser (their contact details are listed below). Thank you.

Our work parties provide an interesting and lively mix of practical work and informal training. Each work day will consist of a brief introduction to the nature reserve and its management. There will also be some training in tool use and appropriate health and safety issues. **Details of the locations of our nature reserves can be found on our website** www.northwaleswildlifetrust.org.uk You will need to wear work clothes and stout boots/wellingtons and bring along waterproofs and a packed lunch and a drink. We will supply work gloves and tools. Please make sure your work boots or wellies are clean; biosecurity is an important part of our work - you can find out more on our website.

Wednesday 7th January

Gwaith Powdwr, near Penrhyndeudraeth, Gwynedd. 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. From 1865 until 1995 this site was home to a world-renowned explosives factory. North Wales Wildlife Trust took over the site when it was decommissioned in 1998 & since then nature has flourished. Today we will be carrying out various tasks around the nature reserve including heathland management to provide habitat for nightjars and reptiles, and clearance work in the wetland areas alongside the stream. Wednesday 7th January

Cors Goch, near Llanbedrgoch, Anglesey. 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. The complex geology and wealth of different habitats make Cors Goch one of Wales's most diverse, colourful nature reserves & part of an internationally significant network of fens in Anglesey. Today we will be carrying out a variety of different work around the nature reserve including heathland management. Please contact Matt Cole if you would like to attend.

Thursday 8th January

Every Thursday we will be working on one of our nature reserves in the County of Conwy (10 a.m. until 4 p.m.). This includes our three nature reserves near Llandudno and Cors Bodgynydd, near Betws y Coed. Our work on these reserves can be weather dependent – we will always be working on one of them every Thursday, but the weather forecast will determine which one! Friday 9th January

Llyn Celanedd (Spinnies Aberogwen), near Bangor, Gwynedd. Morning only 10 a.m. until 1 p.m.

A series of lagoons and surrounding habitat provide shelter & food for wildfowl, waders and smaller birds, especially during the autumn & spring migrations. Today we will be carrying out a variety of tasks around the reserve including reed cutting and a litter pick along the shoreline. There will be an opportunity to do some bird watching so don't forget your binoculars! Meet at the nature reserve at 10 a.m. Contact Matt Cole for more information.

Tuesday 13th January

Bryn Ifan, near Clynnog Fawr. 10 a.m. until 4 p.m.

Today we will be working with Dafydd Thomas, our Bryn Ifan Project Officer, carrying out various jobs at our recently acquired 450-acre site on the Llŷn Peninsula. Working in partnership with local farmers and communities, North Wales Wildlife Trust intends to restore nature at Bryn Ifan for the benefit of people and wildlife. Today we will be clearing away some old fencing and carrying out scrub clearance work in one of the wetland areas. Please contact Dafydd Thomas if you would like to attend.

Wednesday 14th January

Caeau Tan-y-bwlch, near Clynnog Fawr. 10 a.m. until 4.00 p.m.

Swathed in wild flowers in spring & summer and offering lovely views of the coast, these traditional hay meadows offer a glimpse of our countryside's past. Today we'll be working in the wetter areas of the nature reserve, cutting and clearing willow. Don't forget your wellies! Please contact Luke Jones if you would like to attend.

Wednesday 14th January

Cors Goch, near Llanbedrgoch, Anglesey. 10 a.m. until 4.00 p.m.

Cors Goch reflects a long history of human activity. Used by the local community for centuries, it's a place where cattle grazed, reeds were cut and stone was quarried to make millstones. Discover the spectacular patchwork of habitats, each with its own unique character and array of wildlife. Today we'll be carrying out work on the heathland. Mariandyrys, near Llangoed, Anglesey. 10 a.m. until 4 p.m.

This nature reserve lies on a rocky limestone outcrop that raises it above the surrounding area and offers stunning, far-reaching views all year round. In spring and summer, this site comes alive with wildflowers that thrive on this lime-rich soil. Today we will be carrying out heathland management work. Wednesday 21st January

Coed Crafnant, Llanbedr, near Harlech. 9 a.m. until 4 p.m.

Filled with primitive plants and ancient oak trees, a visit to Coed Crafnant feels like stepping back in time to the ancient wildwoods of Wales. Today we will be carrying out halo thinning - a woodland operation which retains space and light around our old oak trees. This is beneficial for the trees and for the wildlife that lives in the many niches that these ancient trees provide. Please contact Luke Jones if you would like to attend.

Thursday 22nd January

Bryn Ifan, near Clynnog Fawr. 10 a.m. until 4 p.m.

Today we will be working with Dafydd Thomas, our Bryn Ifan Project Officer, carrying out various different jobs around the site including improvements to the public rights and way; scrub clearance; fencing repairs and possibly some tree planting. Wednesday 28th January

Gwaith Powdwr, near Penrhyndeudraeth, Gwynedd. 10 a.m. until 4.00 p.m. Our work focusses on maintaining the variety of habitats whilst protecting the history of the nature reserve. Today we will be working in the tree nursery, potting up naturally regenerating oak and holly seedlings with Sarah Ellis, our Tree Nurseries' Officer. Canolfan Addysg Conwy. 10 a.m. until 4 p.m.
