Summer is a wonderful time of year to volunteer on our nature reserves and discover why they are such special places.

Our work parties provide an interesting and lively mix of practical work and informal training. Each work day will consist of a brief introduction to the nature reserve and its management. We will supply work gloves and tools. Please make sure your work boots or wellies are clean; biosecurity is an important part of our work - you can find out more on our website.

Tuesday 1st September

Dolgarrog, Conwy Valley. 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. Meet at the Community Centre in Dolgarrog. What3words: measuring.froth.heightens; Postcode: LL32 8JU.

Today we will be working with our Gwneud Traciau (Making Tracks)

Project in Dolgarrog. This is a 2 ½ year-long project, funded by the Nature Networks Programme. It is being delivered by the Heritage Fund, on behalf of the Welsh Government.

Our work today involves removing invasive, non-native plants from the Memorial Gardens and woodlands and helping contractors with fencing and step installation. Coed Crafnant, Llanbedr, near Harlech. 10 a.m. until 3.30 p.m.

Filled with primitive plants and ancient oak trees, a visit to Coed Crafnant feels like stepping back in time to the ancient wildwoods of Wales. Today we will be doing a variety of jobs including removing old sections of post and wire fencing in the woodland. Oak trees have successfully regenerated inside these tree guards and no longer require protection. Please contact Luke Jones if you would like to attend.

Wednesday 2nd September

Cemlyn, near Cemaes Bay, Anglesey. 10 a.m. until 4.00 p.m.

Situated on the wild north coast of Anglesey, with its unique, elliptical shingle ridge, Cemlyn is an incredible site to visit. From May through to July the islands within the lagoon host nesting colonies of Sandwich, common and Arctic terns. After a successful tern breeding season, we will be doing our end of season tasks out on the nature reserve. Please contact Matt Cole if you would like to attend.

Llyn Celanedd (Spinnies Aberogwen), near Bangor, Gwynedd. **Morning session only 10 a.m. until 1.30 p.m.** Meet at our nature reserve at 10 a.m. Lifts may be available from our Bangor Office, leaving at around 9.30 a.m.

The series of lagoons and surrounding habitat at Llyn Celanedd provide shelter & food for wildfowl, waders, and smaller birds, especially during the autumn & spring migrations. Today we will be carrying out a variety of tasks around the nature reserve including cutting back footpaths, tidying the bird hides, and doing a litter pick along the shoreline. Discover the spectacular patchwork of habitats, each with its own unique character and array of wildlife.
